

The Absaroka Mountains, where Preacher was ambushed




Crow Indians, who ambushed Preacher

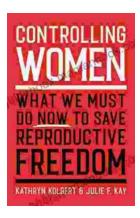
