## **French Baby And Toddler Thumbless Mittens Knitting Pattern**

### ### Materials

- Medium-weight yarn (approximately 100 yards for baby mittens, 150 yards for toddler mittens) - French knitting loom (24 pegs) - Yarn needle - Scissors

### ### Abbreviations

- CO: Cast on - K: Knit - BO: Bind off

### ### Instructions

**\*\*Baby Mittens (0-6 months)\*\***

- CO 24 sts - K until mittens measure 4 inches in length - BO all sts

**\*\*Toddler Mittens (6-12 months)\*\***

- CO 24 sts - K until mittens measure 5 inches in length - BO all sts

### ### Joining the Mittens

- Unravel a small section of yarn from the beginning of one mitten. - Thread the yarn through the yarn needle and stitch the two mittens together along the side. - Once joined, weave in the loose ends.

### ### Finishing Touches

- Fold the top edge of the mittens over and stitch it down to create a cuff. - Add any embellishments or embroidery to your liking.

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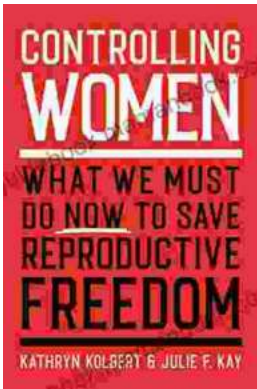
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
