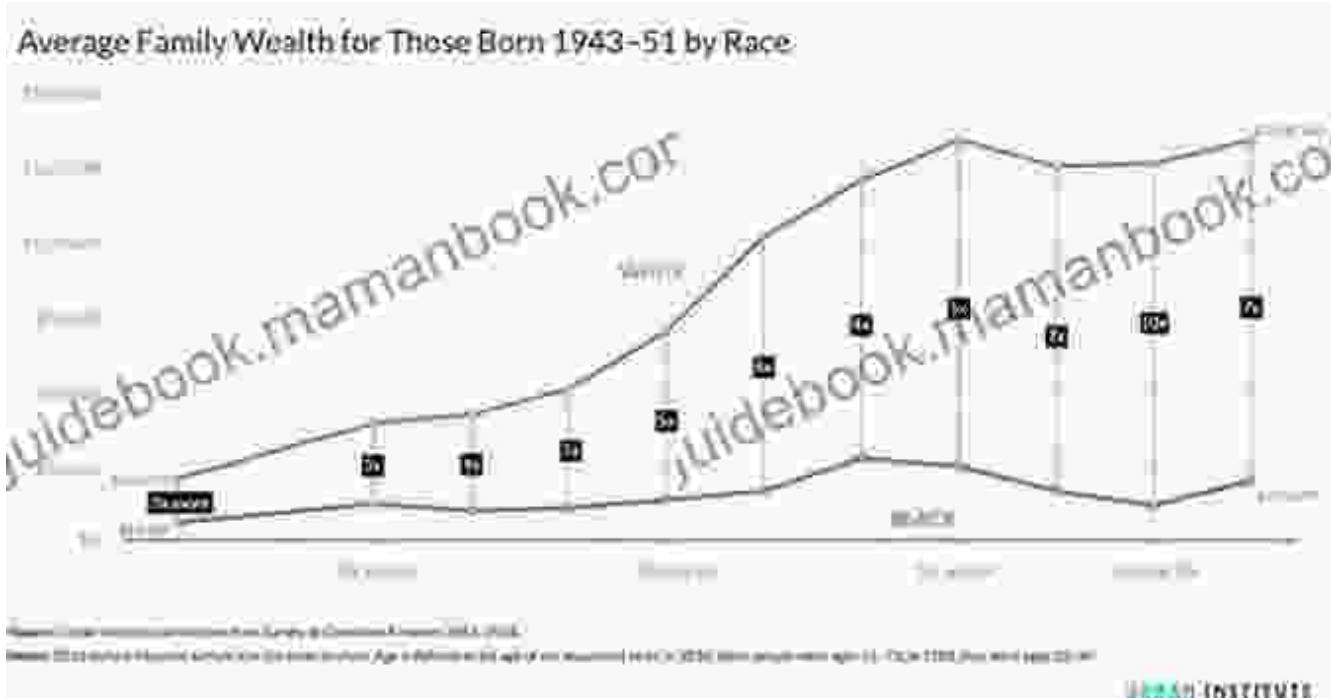

Inequality



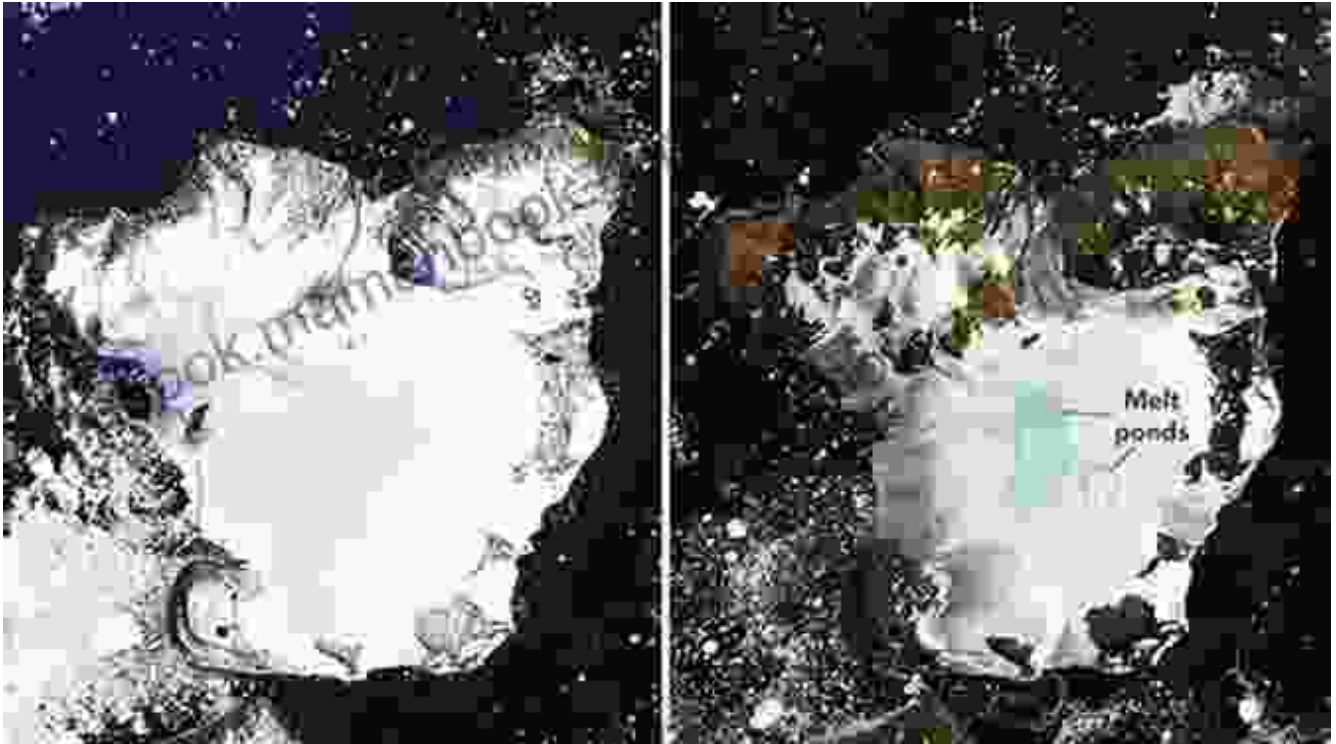

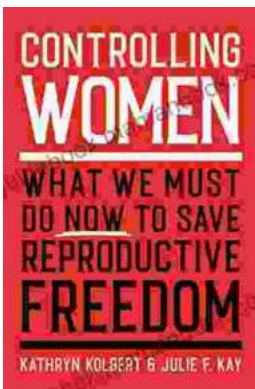
